### Our initiatives include

- ✓ Developing a shared understanding and commitment to developing writing stamina with reference to the general capabilities in the Australian Curriculum and across all Key Learning Areas
- ✓ Enhancing teacher knowledge of Australian Curriculum writing through deepening knowledge of Achievement Standards and curriculum intent through the pre-moderation process.
- ✓ Providing time for teaching staff to plan effectively for writing using data to inform the teaching and learning program aligned to the Australian Curriculum
- ✓ Engaging teachers in action research projects to reflect on writing instruction, collecting & analysing data, and using the data to inform their practice
- ✓ Deepening staff knowledge and understanding of pedagogical values and beliefs shared at Oakwood State School. Engaging in professional conversations regarding best practice in 'how to teach writing' and all key learning areas.
- ✓ Creating inclusive opportunities for all students to reach their potential as successful learners; identifying and supporting top students, students with disability and at-risk students
